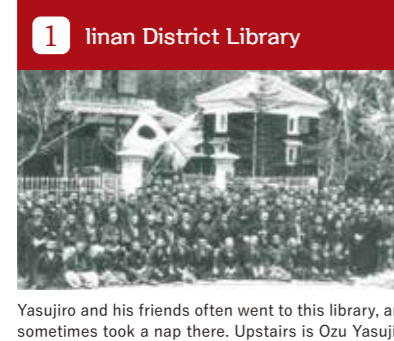




**Ozu Yasujiro Memorial Museum of Matsusaka**  
(2F of Matsusaka City Museum of History and Folklore)



**1 Iinan District Library**  
Yasujiro and his friends often went to this library, and sometimes took a nap there. Upstairs is Ozu Yasujiro Memorial Museum now.



**2 Matsusaka Park (Matsusaka Castle Ruins)**  
This castle was built by the warlord Gamo Ujisato and now is used as a park. Yasujiro often went there with his friends or family to see cherry and plum blossoms, wisteria trellis, etc.



**3 Suzu-no-Ya (Former Residence of Motoori Norinaga)**  
The scholar of ancient Japanese literature and culture Motoori Norinaga lived in this house for about 60 years. Yasujiro learned about Norinaga there.



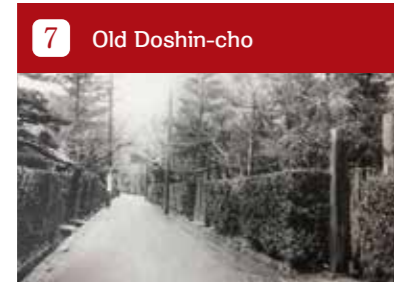
**4 Castle Guard Residences**  
These are the houses where 20 samurai officials of the Kishu Domain lived. As a movie director, Yasujiro said, "I want to shoot a movie here..."



**5 Matsusaka Shrine**  
Yasujiro wrote in his diary that he often visited this shrine, which has a 900-year-old camphor tree.



**6 Old Mie Prefectural Technical School (Now: Matsusaka Technical High School)**  
It was founded as the first secondary educational institution in Matsusaka and the first technical high school in the prefecture. Yasujiro often came to watch baseball there.



**7 Old Doshin-cho**  
This is the place where the samurai officials called "Doshin" lived. Yasujiro went through this street when going to Matsusaka Park.



**8 Site of Ozu Yoemon's House**  
Yasujiro's father, Toranosuke, was the sixth head of the Ozu Shinshichi's family, which is a branch of the merchant Ozu Yoemon's family. So, this place is one of his roots.



**9 Site of Matsusaka-Za (Matsusaka Theater)**  
"Matsusaka-Za" is the successor of "Matsusaka Performance Theater" in the Edo period (1603-1868). Yasujiro watched a lot of movies there.



**10 Okaderasan Keicho-ji Temple (Okadera Kannon)**  
It is affectionately called "Okadera-san". Many people visit this temple on Hatsu-uma (the first horse day) in February (of the lunar calendar).



**11 Naka-machi Street (Yanagi-ya Hozen)**  
Yanagi-ya Hozen is a long-established confectionery store. There is a receipt given to the Ozu family when they bought sweets in 1916.

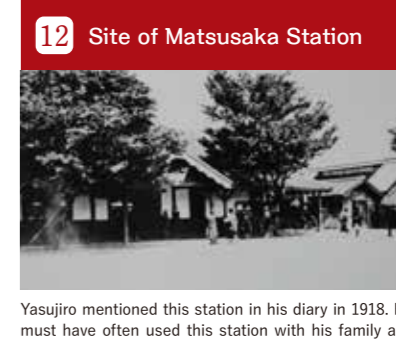

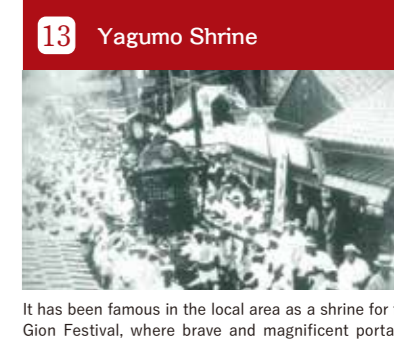

**12 Site of Matsusaka Station**  
Yasujiro mentioned this station in his diary in 1918. He must have often used this station with his family and friends.



**13 Yagumo Shrine**  
It has been famous in the local area as a shrine for the Gion Festival, where brave and magnificent portable shrines are carried. Yasujiro described it in his essay.



**14 Minato-machi Street (Nagai's Main House)**  
The main house of the wealthy merchant Nagai was at this corner. After Yasujiro's aunt Fumi married into this family, this street became more familiar to him.



**15 Oshiroi-machi**  
There were many of Yasujiro's elementary friends' houses, favorite restaurants, family doctor's office, etc.



**16 Site of Daini Jinjo Elementary School**  
Since his family moved to Matsusaka, Yasujiro was transferred to the 4th year of Daini Jinjo Elementary School. A part of this site is used as a park now.



**17 Site of Hirao-machi Station**  
The station of Keihin Railways (Later became Matsusaka Railways) in Hirao-machi. Since it was the nearest station from Yasujiro's house, he often used this station.



**18 Atagosan Ryusen-ji Temple**  
It is affectionately called "Atago-san". As it was close to his house and Kagura-za Theater, Yasujiro often visited there.



**19 Site of Kagura-za Theater**  
This movie theater was only 400 meters from Yasujiro's house. It had a great influence on his life as a movie director.



**20 Site of Izutsu**  
Eel restaurant near his house. One of many receipts found in the Ozu family's warehouse is the receipt of eel rice bowls given by this restaurant with the date of his birth.



**21 Site of Miyamae Jinjo Higher Elementary School**  
This is an elementary school where Yasujiro worked for as a substitute teacher for one year. Now Ozu Yasujiro Reference Room is there.
